Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty!

Scripture Allusions, Bible References, and Background for the Favorite Hymn, "Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty!"

Scriptures:

"So He drove the man out; and at the east of the garden of Eden He stationed the *cherubim*^a and the flaming sword which turned every direction to guard the way to the tree of life." (Genesis 3:24, italics added). (Definitions for superscripted words are located at the end of this section.)

"In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, lofty and exalted, with the train of His robe filling the temple. *Seraphim*^b stood above Him, each having six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. And one called out to another and said, "*Holy, Holy, Holy*," is the LORD of hosts, The whole earth is full of His glory." (Isaiah 6:1-3, italics added)

"Now the *cherubim*^a were standing on the right side of the temple when the man entered, and the cloud filled the inner court. Then the glory of the LORD went up from the cherub to the threshold of the temple, and the temple was filled with the cloud and the court was filled with the brightness of the glory of the LORD. Moreover, the sound of the wings of the *cherubim*^a was heard as far as the outer court, like the voice of *God Almighty* when He speaks." (Ezekiel 10:3-5, italics added)

"After these things I looked, and behold, a door standing open in heaven, and the first voice which I had heard, like the sound of a trumpet speaking with me, said, 'Come up here, and I will show you what must take place after these things.' Immediately I was in the Spirit; and behold, a throne was standing in heaven, and One sitting on the throne. And He who was sitting was like a jasper stone and a sardius in appearance; and there was a rainbow around the throne, like an emerald in appearance. Around the throne were twenty-four thrones; and upon the thrones I saw twenty-four elders sitting, clothed in white garments, and *golden crowns*^d on their heads." (Revelation 4:1-4)

"Out from the throne come flashes of lightning and sounds and peals of thunder. And there were seven lamps of fire burning before the throne, which are the seven Spirits of God; and before the throne there was something like a *sea of*

glass^e, like crystal; and in the center and around the throne, four living creatures full of eyes in front and behind. The first creature was like a lion, and the second creature like a calf, and the third creature had a face like that of a man, and the fourth creature was like a flying eagle. And the four living creatures, each one of them having six wings, are full of eyes around and within; and day and night they do not cease to say, 'Holy, Holy, Holy^f is the Lord, the Almighty, who was and who is and who is to come.'" (Revelation 4:5-8, italics added)

And when the living creatures give glory and honor and thanks to Him who sits on the throne, to Him who lives forever and ever, the twenty-four elders will *fall down before Him* who sits on the throne, and will worship Him who lives forever and ever, and will *cast their crowns*^d *before the throne*, saying, 'Worthy are You, our Lord and our God, to receive glory and honor and power; for You created all things, and because of Your will they existed, and were created.' "(Revelation 4:9-11, italics added)

^aCherubim – The Hebrew word is k^erûwb (*ker-oob'*) (Ref. 2, Hebrew #3742) = *a cherub* or imaginary figure: – cherub, [plural] cherubims. Ref. 3 describes Cherubim as "probably an order of angelic beings."

bSeraphim – The Hebrew word is sârâph (*saw-rawf*') (Refs. 2 and 3, Hebrew #8314) = burning, i.e. (figuratively) poisonous (serpent); specifically, a seraph or symbolical creature from their copper color: – fiery (serpent), seraph. *Note* - The seraphim was capable of speaking (refer to Isaiah 6:6-7).

^cHoly – The Hebrew word is qâdôsh (*kaw-doshe'*) (Refs. 2 and 3, Hebrew # 6918) = sacred (ceremonially or morally); (as a noun) God (by eminence), an angel, a saint, a sanctuary. Ref. 3

^dCrowns – The Greek word is stephanos (*stef'-an-os*) (Ref. 2, Greek # 4735) = twine, wreath; a chaplet (as a badge of royalty, a prize in public games, a symbol of honor generally). Ref. 3 adds, "a mark of royal exalted rank."

^eGlass – The Greek word is hualinos (*hoo-al'*-ee-nos) (Refs. 2 and 3, Greek # 5193) = glassy, i.e. transparent. *Note* - "Hualinos" is an adjective. Reginald Heber (the hymn text author) describes the scene in verse 2:

"Holy, holy! All the saints adore Thee, Casting down their golden crowns around the glassy sea"

^fHoly – The Greek word is hagiŏs (*hag'*- ee-os) (Refs. 2 and 3, Greek # 40) = sacred (physically, pure, morally blameless or religious, ceremonially, consecrated) – (most) holy (one, thing), saint

All scripture references are from the New American Standard Bible (Refs. 1 and 4).

Background:

Reginald Heber (1783–1826) was an Anglican pastor and later the bishop of Calcutta, India (Refs. 5 and 6). As pastor, he was always trying to improve the music at his church in Hodnet, England which he served for sixteen years. After his death, his widow found his papers including the lyrics for 57 hymns in a trunk. Those papers included the lyrics for the great Trinitarian hymn, "Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty!" (Ref. 6)

John Bacchus Dykes (1823-1876) was an English clergyman and hymnist. In 1861, he composed the tune named "Nicaea" for "Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty!" (Refs. 5 and 7). The tune NICAEA is named after the Council of Nicaea (A.D. 325) at which church leaders began to formulate the doctrine of the Trinity (Ref. 8). John Bacchus Dykes also is known for other notable hymn tunes such as Melita ("Eternal Father Strong to Save") (Refs. 7 and 9).
